SENATE BILLS:

SB 454 — Amends Act 106 making it a misdemeaner for individuals who dispose, dump, or place oil or other liquids that are detrimental to the public health, safety or environment on the ground or Into Michigan lakes and streams.

SB 453 — Amends the Clean Michigan Fund Act requiring that the Natural Resources Commission conduct a series of waste stream assessments in representative areas of the state. It also establishes grant programs in the following areas: Resource recovery education; solid waste transfer stations; waste-to-energy capital grant program; waste reduction capital: composting operational program; household hazardous waste program; bousehold hazardous waste program;

SB 288 — Establishes a six-dollar deposit on purchases of lead acid batteries, beginning January 1992, and convenes a Joint legislative committee to study the safe use, recycling options and disposal of nickel cadmium and mercury batteries.

SB 440 — Gives a taxpayer purchasing recyclable material for the purpose of converting the material into new products or into material used to produce new products, a tax credit equal to 15 percent of the amount the taxpayer spends to purchase the recyclable materials from a qualified recovery center.

Based on the increasing number of requests for information and programs since fall, Concern Description, and the since fall, Concern Description, inc. knows there is a growing awareness that recycling is being wiewed as a positive alternative to solid waste disposal. The Michigan legislature as a result of this growing concern introduced a number of recycling bills during the last session. The following list of bills excerpted from Water Impacts. Newsletter outlines to bills. For the current status of these and other environmental legislation, call or write your legislator.

HB 4821 - Amends Act 431 requiring that state agency supplies, materials and equipment be made from recycled materials if there is a readily available source. The minimum percentage of recycled materials is 10 percent in 1999; 15 percent in 1990; and 20 percent in 1991 and beyond. The cost of the recycled materials is cannot exceed this percent of the same item using non-recycled materials.

HB 4822 — Amends the Clean Michigan Fund Act requiring the DNR to create a program to assist municipallities and private entities and identifying location of sources and source separated materials available for conversion into raw materials or products.

HB 4011 — Obliges the Department of Commerce with DNR assistance to assemble an interstate task force to plan and develop markets for certain recyclable materials that require interstate cooperation to generate and collect sufficient materials to assure economic feasibility of a recycling enterprise.

Conservation, Recreation and Envi-ronment Committee:

HB 4083 — Requires all packag-ing materials that are designed to be discarded and are used by fast-food restaurants to package indi-vidual portions of prepared food and drink sold in Michigan for di-rect consumption be composed en-tirely of degradeable materials.

HB 4067 — Amends Act 641 prohibiting whole thres from being disposed of in landfills.

Nuthatch: A seasonal visitor

This winter is the season of the red-breasted nuthatch. Many people who feed birds have told me that they have had a new nuthatch at their feeder. Most observers are quite familiar with the white-breasted nuthatch, so they knew when a new species appears.



Both the white and red-breasted nuthatches forage by going down a tree trunk head first. Unlike woodpeckers and creepers who also go up a tree, nuthatches view from a different perspective and find food other birds missed.

other birds missed.

They are similar in their coloration too. A blue-gray back with black to dark gray on the top of their bead is a comon coloration to both. But the red-breasted nuthatch is slightly smaller, has a black line through the yes separating white above and below, and they have reddish underparts.

RED-BREASTED nuthatches typically nest in the northern part of the state in coniferous forests of spruce,



pine and fir. Occasionally nests have been found in the southern tier of counties. They excavate a cavity in a dead tree and smear pine resin around the opening. It is believed that it keeps some predators from entering the nest. Some experiments have shown that snakes are deterred by pine resin.

When a red-breasted nuthatch is seen around the Detroit area it is seen around the Detroit decent of the state. But there are years when the come production in the conference is low, which causes irruptions of this species in new areas.

Most years reveal a few birds in southeastern Michigan, but some

years, like 1957, 1969, 1975 and 1989 Indicated a greater number than usual. The 1989 Detroit Audubon So-ictly's Christmas Bird Count record-ed the greatest number of red-breasted nuthatches in its 45-year history.

Regular counts like this and those sponsored by the federal government help us to monitor trends in hird population on a broad scale. In some cases, these same trends can
