REGULAR CITY COUNCIL PUBLIC HEARING MEETING
MARCH 19, 1990

Mayor Fox called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Members Present: Mayor Fox, Mayor Pro-Tem Vognoni, Bates, Lichtman, Marks, and Sever. Members Absent: Grant. Others Present: City Manager Costick, Assistant City Manager Call, City Clerk Dornan, Director of Planning and Community Development Costigan, Planning Consultant Coates, and City Attorney Bileau.

COUNCIL APPROVED SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT FOR:

• Road Improvement for Green Acres, north of Bond, and Firwood from 120 feet east of Gladstone to Orchard Lake Road and adjoined public hearing on road improvement for Bond Boulevard to April 9, 1990.

• Water Main Installation for the east half of the Oaklands Subdivision.

COUNCIL APPROVED INTRODUCTION OF THE FOLLOWING ZONING

TEXT AMENDMENTS TO FARMINGTON HILLS CITY CODE, CHAPTER 34:

• No. 1, 1989, Section 34-043, "Signs" to permit administrative approval of entranceway structures under specific conditions.

• No. 2, 1990, Section 34-359, to permit basketball backboards and hoops in front yards and minimum side yards.

• No. 4, 1990, Section 34-552, to replace outdated section on Agricultural uses in RA districts.

• No. 5, 1990, Section 34-553, to preclude parking of employee vehicles in connection with home occupants.

• No. 7, 1990, Section 34-555, change "Tethering" of horses to confinement.

• No. 8, 1990, Section 34-551, to prevent use of barbed wire in residential areas and clarify the fence provision section as to permitted fence structures.

CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS NOTICE TO CUT WEEDS

It shall be the duty of all owners of subdivided land within any subdivision within the boundaries of the City of Farmington Hills and the owners of all land located within an area of 100 feet or less from a platted subdivision in which there are buildings on 60% of the lots and all land within 100 feet of any major roads, within the boundaries of the City of Farmington Hills to destroy any noxious weeds growing on said property before they reach a flower bearing stage, and to prevent them from becoming a detriment to public health. Any weeds not cut by June 1, 1990 may be cut by the City and if cut by the City, the owner of the property will be charged with the cost under the provisions of the Farmington Hills City Code, Chapter 17, Article II, Section 17-28 through 17-31. This may be done as many times as is necessary during the growing season. In addition to the above costs, any owner who shall refuse to cut the weeds as provided for in this Article shall, upon a finding of being responsible, be subject to a civil fine of not more than five hundred (\$500.00) dollars. Noxious weeds are those plants described in Section 2, of ACT 359 of the Public Acts of 1941, as amended, and all other weeds, wild grasses, and plants the uncontrolled growth of which would constitute a nuisance.

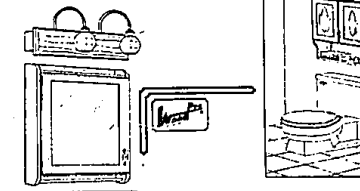

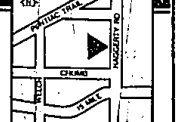
