Officials renew threat of lawsuit

Dornan said Tuesday he remains
"optimistic" the two sides will resume talks and avert a court battle
over the city's plans to create a DDA
aimed, in part, at making major
oad improvements.

Geisler, in a tersely worded onepage statement, accused the city of
"suddenly and without warning" proposing a DDA plan on April 26 that
triples the cost of an earlier proposal
which was in the process of being
aegottated.

mise, without which agreement in the public interest is impossible," he sald.

Geisler issued the statement Mon-day after meeting with Dornan earli-er in the day.

Geisler contended the city has ex-panded the DDA plan to \$20 million from earlier estimates of \$6 million, increasing the number of municipal projects from three to 10.

Dornan disputed Gelsler's state-ment and pegged the cost at \$13 mil-

Geisler said that Walled Lake School District residents will pay more than half that cost of the DDA project, which would be funded by Lax revenues from future property assessment increases in the DDA dis-

Except for his meeting with Gei-sler on Monday, Dernan said school and cily officials have not met to discuss the DDA project since April 18. The city is "certainly willing" to continue negotiations, Dornan said, though he did not have a commit-ment from school officials that they will delay filling a lawsuit.
