

Committee still taking tree orders

Orders for trees through the 1990 city of Farmington tree planting program will be accepted until May 10, said Carol Kurth, chairperson. Kicked off during Arbor Week in April, this program is available to all residents and businesses in the city and will serve to help reforest the community and serve to replace diseased trees. The cost for the five varieties of trees is \$140, covering the tree planting, one-year guarantee replacement and the tree itself.

Those trees being sold through a special contract with Steinkopf Nursery are: the Norway maple, Rubrum maple, Skyline locust, Greenspire Linden and Marshall seedless ash. All trees will be a minimum of 1 1/2 inches in diameter. Those planting trees on private property must contact MISS DIG at 1-800-482-7171 for location of cable and utility lines underground. Responsibility for staking the proper location is that of the consumer.

Checks in the amount of \$140 should accompany the order and be made out to the City of Farmington. Payment will be accepted at the City Treasurer's Office at City Hall on Grand River. "Sponsored by the City of Farmington Beautification Committee, this program is one more effort to enhance the beauty of the community and to provide an environmental means to aid the cooling, the air quality, and the aesthetics of the Farmington community," Kurth said.

District schedules technology seminar

The annual spring in-service for Farmington Public Schools' employees will focus on technology this year.
