

Ocelots reach regional

One single stroke has transformed Schoolcraft College's golf team, from program builders to respectable challengers.

And at the conclusion of today's National Junior College Athletic Association Region 12 tournament at Bedford Valley Golf Club in Battle Creek, Ocelot coach Carolyn Steffen wouldn't be at all surprised if her team took another step up the ladder — to contender.

In their initial season last year, the Ocelots "had one individual make it as far as the regionals," noted Steffen. "This year, the whole team made it. I'd say that's progress."

And she'd be right, although advancing to the regional tournament was accomplished by the slimmest of margins. The top six teams at the

13-team Michigan Community College Athletic Association Tournament at Gull Lake View Golf Course in Augusta Tuesday and Wednesday qualified for the regional.

SC FINISHED sixth — by one stroke.

Lansing CC captured the state title, shooting 850 in the 54-hole tournament. Grand Rapids CC was second with 961, followed by Kalamazoo Valley CC (969), St. Clair County CC (978), Oakland CC (981) and SC (986).

Muskegon CC was next at 987, with Glen Oaks CC close behind at 989. Other team scores were Macomb CC, 1013; Alpena CC, 1049; and Delta

CC, 1083. Mott CC and Henry Ford CC had golfers in the tournament, but neither had enough for a team score.

Andy Kurnez topped the Ocelots and was the tournament leader after the first round, firing a 75. He followed that with rounds of 85 and 79 to finish at 239, earning him all-state honors (awarded to those scoring under 240).

Kevin Zaschak narrowly missed the all-state squad, scoring 242 to place second among the Ocelots. Chris McMahon was next for SC at 245, followed by Dewey Steffen (285) and Jeff Vos (275).

The state results left Carolyn Steffen optimistic regarding the regional. "I'm just proud of the entire team," she said. "I certainly believe in miracles, major or minor."

ALL THE GREAT names in women's bowling — Aileen Wagner, Robin Romeo, Lisa Wagner, Jeanne Maiden, Cheryl Daniels, Leanne Barrette, Betty Morris, Dennis Adams, Dele Davidson, Cindy Coburn, Lorrie Nichols, Carol Norman, Judy Soutar, Leila Wagner and many more — are in this area for the Searams Coolers 120,000 U.S. Open next week at Satellite Bowl in Dearborn Heights.

In all, 340 bowlers will be competing for honors and prize money, with the champion pocketing \$24,000, the largest on the pro tour.

The U.S. Open has been considered the top event in women's bowling and is the richest in terms of prize money.

The defending champion is Robin Romeo of Van Nuys, Calif. She will be hard pressed to repeat, due to challenges from local ladies like Aleta Sill, Cheryl Daniels and Dele Davidson, who all will be top winners on the pro tour.

This could even be the year of the amateur, as a very strong contingent will be trying to win the best shot.
