Stair climbing step in right direction

Dear Myrna: My bushand just bought a step machine for us to use. I really prefer an exercise class, but I feel I mist use this machine. Are these machine good and are they considered aerobic? Yes — stair climbing by machine is considered aerobic as long as you work continuously for at least 25 minutes at your target heart rate.

These machines are interesting inventions. The stair climbing machines have steps that work against hydraulic resistance. Similar to a treadmill, the step fails as your weight activates it. A ladder-like climber lets you step with your left leg and pull with your right arm at the same time and vice versa against resistance provided by your body weight.

YOU HAVENT indicated to me what kind of machine you have.

Some are more effective than others, although all of them are effective calorie burners and give you an aerobic training effect, too.

Several of these machines don't give you a sensation of climbing stairs, but feel like riding a bike by standing on the pedats instead of sitting on the saddle. The resistance can be increased on most machines to raise the intensity of your workout.

Stair climbing can be an effective part of an exercise program. This is why my studie is now starting a new class called stepping. If you already prefer a class format and like climbing stairs, it adds a perfect variety to your aerobic workout.

STEPPING (I call it), whether it be a machine or incorporated in an exercise class, is a nice change. You don't have to be coordinated. You can be a beginner—the intensity can be adjusted. Being on the President's Council on Physical Pitness, I had a once-in-a-illetime chance to beach aerobics at the Great American Workout, May I on the south lawn of the White House. We had 15 sports stations headed by sports stars and Olympig of medalists. To my surprise, the station next to mine (aerobic dance) was called stepping aerobics. I think that says a mouthful. Happy stepping to you!

Bear hunting applications will be available beginning May 27, and hunters have until June 27 to upply for one of the 4,191 permits available for the 1990 fail hunting season. The quota is espected to allow one in every three hunters who upply to receive a permit. The Department of Natural Resources estimates that between 800 and 1,100 bear will be taken during the fail hunt which begins Sept. 10.

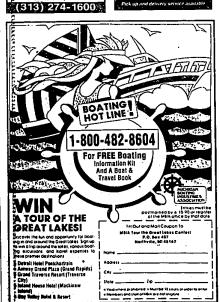
