Here are suggestions and varieties that can be planted now. Approximate days for germination are in parentheses: African daisy (6-14); cancel witches away according to ten calculuit (4-16), their hot colors will keep witches away according to lego an easy one (4-14); common (4-20), can be dried and cleome (10-20), the spider flower.

Others to try are: cornflower (4-8); dlanthus (10-15) with a clove-like fragrance; forget-me-not (7-14) will self-sow; gailardia or blanket flower (10-20); globe amaranth (10-15), also dries well in several colors; marigold (7-10); nasturtium (7-10) good, peppery flavor to ad to salads; nectiana (14-18) with heavenly fragrance.




