early June. Jim Fordell, alde to bill sponsor Rep. William Keith, D-Garden City, sald most Oakland County school dis-tricts would receive 8-9 percent state funding increases under the bill. BUT RICHARD SIMONSON, as-sistant superintendent for Oakland Intermediate Schools, sald the fund-ing boost is deceptive because it glosses over costs each school would have to shoulder for programs the bill proposes to cut.
