THE SEMATE last week gave 32-3 approval to House Bill 5479, the so-called "regulatory budget." It covers the departments of Commerce, Labor, and Licensing and Regulation. "We've pared almost \$20 million off the governor's recommendation (1999 million)." said Cruce, who chairs the Senate Appropriations subcommittee handling it, ite said the tax money could be used for

other purposes.

The bill goes back to the House for concurrence in the Senate amendments. If, as seems likely, the House fails to concur, the bill will go to a House-Senate conference commit-

tee.


