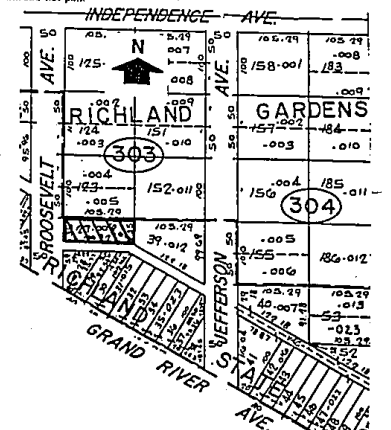

This property lies on the east side of Roosevelt Avenue, north of Grand River Avenue. The above mentioned request would rezone the above-described property from its present B-3, General Business District classification to P-1, Vehicular Parking District classification.

The proponent in this matter, is the Planning Commission of the City of Farmington Hills, who seeks this rezoning in order to provide a land use buffer to the adjacent residential property.

Chambers form group to advise local leaders

The newly formed Leadership Oakland is designed to help develop the knowledge community leaders must have to lead the county.

It has formed under the guidance of the Council of Chambers of Commerce of Oakland County Inc.

A steering committee composed of 70 prominent individuals from public and private businesses and organizations in Oakland County has been established to select program topics and provide overall direction to the organization.

The Leadership Oakland Selection Committee will choose participants from among nominees distributed throughout the community. From 20 to 40 candidates will be notified by Aug. 1 of their acceptance.

Participation is sought from persons who have an interest in serving the county by seeking major volunteer and/or appointed leadership roles. Tuition is \$1,000, which in many cases will be paid by the participant's employer.

Prospective participants are invited to learn more about Leadership Oakland at a reception 5:30-7 p.m. Wednesday, June 6. They will meet with other prospective participants and media representatives, and hear highlights of the 1990-91 program.

The first Leadership Oakland program will begin with a one-day leadership skills workshop in October.

In a series of seven full-day sessions to follow during the next six months, participants will concentrate on such topics as education, the economy, government, justice, health and human services, and the arts and entertainment.
