Spartans win WLAA title

Last year a thunderstorm cut short Livonia Stevensors's bid to win the Western Lakes Activities Association girls track championship.
But lightning wouldn't strike twice as the Spartans won their first-ever WIAA crown Tuesday user Celer Seles, holding off a stern challengen to the common tools Plymouth Satem and Plymouth Canton.

Stevenson, which had to settle for second in last year's storm-shortened meet, came back strong to score a team-high 13.45 points, followed by Salem (146.20) and Canton (111.5). Farmington was a distant fourth with 71.20. See statistical summary.

"It's been a long time," said Stevenson coach Paul Holmberg. "We won the Inter-Lakes, the old league we used to be in 10 years in a row, but never in this league.

"What makes this nice is that this team works extremely hard. They're very coachable."

Stevenson trailed much of the night until the 200-meter dash — the 13th of 16 events — when Lisa Christensen, Debbie Walsh and Nicole Todd combined for 13 points, finishing fourth, fifth and sixth, respectively. That offset the 10 points Salem's Andrea Kinnelly picked up by finishing second.

AND BY THE time the meet's final event, the 1,500 relay, had rolled around, all the Spartans needed was to finish one place shead of Salem. Stevenson's foursome of Christensen, Julie Martin, Tracy Clark and Becky Adamezyk made sure the team trophy was in their possession, nosing out Farmington Harrison for first place with a time of 4:14.31 before the race," said Christensen, the lead-off leg, "I just wanted to win. I had a pretty good day, but for our team to win, that's what we really wanted."

Tears flowed among the Stevenson contingent after Adamezyk held off Harrison's Audra Cockerbam at the wire. Farmington wound up third in
