The Michigan Supreme Court has denied an environmental group a court's one sentence announcement, chance to appeal the state's decision to allow a "campvention" in High-land Recreation Area of northern Oakland County.

"We are not persuaded that the questions presented should be re-

ciation from holding a week long campvention at Highland in July of 1988. LOSER WAS the Highland Recer-ation Defense Foundation, a non-profit group of mostly nearby resi-dents. Winner was the Natural Resources


