

# Man arraigned on sex charges

A Walled Lake man charged with kidnapping a Westland woman from her Novi workplace and raping her in a Farmington Hills motel room was arraigned May 23 before Oakland County Circuit Judge Francis X. O'Brien.

Frank Michael Mole, 34, will face charges in connection with the April 27 incident. An innocent plea was entered on his behalf following his earlier arraignment before District Judge Margaret Schaeffer of Farmington Hills.

- The charges include:
  - Two counts of criminal sexual conduct first-degree, which involves penetration.
  - One count of criminal sexual conduct second degree, which involves forcible touching.
  - One count of kidnapping.
  - One count of larceny over \$100.


Mole is being held in the Oakland County Jail in lieu of \$100,000 cash bond pending trial. He faces up to life in prison if convicted of CSC-first degree and up to 15 years in prison if convicted of CSC-second degree.

## police/fire calls

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week:

• **BARBECUE FIRE**  
Damage was estimated at \$300 when a gas barbecue grill caught fire inside a garage on Northmont May 31. The fire was burning when the regulator hose attaches to the controls, according to a Farmington Hills fire report.

• **APARTMENT FIRE**  
Damage was estimated at \$350 when a grill sitting on a third-floor balcony caught fire at Strawberry Lane Apartments Friday.

• **PRO-LIFE RALLIES**  
Pro-life advocates picketed three sites in Farmington Hills between noon and 3 p.m. Saturday:  
• Botsford General Hospital, 28050 Grand River.  
• Western Women's Center, 23700 Orchard Lake Road.

• A doctor's home in Olde Franklin Towne subdivision, near Middlebelt and Northwestern Highway, was the site of a 45-50 picketers stayed a short time, carrying signs and marching. "There were no problems and no arrests," said Sgt. Richard Krueger of the Farmington Hills police.

• Officers monitored each rally. "There was no blockading of doors, roads or drives, and no disorderly conduct," Krueger said. "The marchers were very orderly and had no confrontations."

• If there had been trouble, he said, officers could have made arrests or issued tickets. But, he said, "there were no problems any place, and we didn't want to create any."

• There were no pro-choice counter-protesters.

• **MAN ROBBED**  
Two men, one armed with a knife, robbed a 32-year-old man of \$50 at 1:15 a.m. Sunday.

• The Farmington Hills resident was robbed while giving the two men a ride from a local bar to what he thought were one of their homes in the Eight Mile/Grand River area.

• As the victim turned east on Shilwassee as requested, one of his passengers pulled a switchblade knife, pointed it at him and said, "Give me all the money you got."

• The victim handed over his money, and the robbers ran off.

• The victim told police he first encountered the two at Shots Tavern, 30859 10 Mile. They asked him for help with their car, a Ford Escort.

• He later agreed to drive them to a house in Farmington Hills but said he first wanted a drink. Over a pitcher of beer, they asked him if he had money to help buy some car parts. He said he did.

• After he was robbed on Shilwassee, west of Inletter Road, the victim returned to Shots Tavern to find the Escort gone.

• **TEENS TICKETED**  
Two 18-year-old men — one from Farmington Hills, the other Northville — were ticketed for disturbing the peace after Farmington Hills police saw them exploding firecrackers near the parking lot of Taco Bell, 23925 Orchard Lake Road, just before 1:30 a.m. Saturday.

• The officers were watching the area because of recent reports of fights and disorderly conduct near the fast-food restaurant.

• **THEFTS REPORTED**  
• Two amplifiers and two speakers, valued at \$2,800, were reported stolen from a garage on Cass, Farmington Hills, June 2-3.

• Jewelry valued at \$1,600 was reported stolen from a house on Bella Vista, Farmington Hills, May 24-25.

# Hills to pick new legal counsel

The Farmington Hills City Council expects to announce its choice for a new city attorney Monday, June 11, following second interviews of three law firms.

The council was scheduled to select a new city attorney May 30 but the decision was postponed at councilwoman Nancy Bates' request.

Though some other council members

said they were prepared to make their choice last week, they agreed to interview their three top choices again so the final decision will be — it's hoped — a mandate, rather than a split vote.

Interviews will begin at 6:30 p.m. Monday, June 11.

The law firms to be interviewed are Kohl, Secrest, Wardle, Lynch, Clark and Hampton, Farmington Hills; Sherman and Sherman, Birmingham; and Levin, Levin, Garrett

and Dill, Southfield. The council chose the three firms in a straw vote at a study session two weeks ago. Six law firms have been interviewed.

The firm selected will replace 22-year veteran city attorney Paul Bibeau and his law firm, Larson, Harms, Wright & Bibeau, Farmington Hills.

The city council a year ago decided to review its consultants, including city attorney and city planner.

But Bibeau announced in April his firm would not seek annual contract renewal.

Bibeau joined Larson, Harms & Wright early last year after he disbanded his firm, Brennan, Bibeau & Poehlman. Last July, the new firm was given a one-year contract, which expires June 30.

Bibeau's firm is expected to work with the new firm to make a smooth transition.
