• PROBE CONTINUES

Novi police are trying to determine if there's a connection between the gunpoint robbery of two Novi men in their Applegate Condominisms home April 5 and the gunpoint robbery of a Farmington man in his attached garage on Frederick May 18.

Similarities between the two rob-beries include use of a gun and a ski mask and the theft of a Holex watch. Neither victim was hurt.

However, the robber in Novi is nought to be taller.

"The robberies have similarities but the heights don't match. We aren't sure it's the same guy — it may be his partner or be totally unconnected," said the Novi detective spearheading the Applegate investigation.

Local police are investigating possible links between five thefts since January involving valuable wristwatehes in Novi, Farmington, Farmington Hills and West Bloomfield. Novi police suspect existence of an organized ring.
