Survey Shows **Lutherans Come** In Many Varieties

A survey is considered good when it reveals what most thinking people probably knew anyway by instinct.

A survey of metropolitan is concerned with traditions, biblical theology and eternal salvation.

Liberal Lutherans tend to accept the "new morality" and "situation ethics."

The differences are brought out in "The Lutheran Ethie: The Impact of Religion on Laymen and Clergy," written by Dr. Lawrence K. Kersten of the Eastern Michigan University faculty and recently published (at \$8.95) by the Wayne State University Press.

Minister Of Evangelism **Works With Orientals**

A new type of ministry focusing its attention on persons of Oriental background who are scattered in the suburbs is being conducted out of the Church of the Savior. 38100 Five Mile, Livonia Heading the program is the Rev. Moody B.W. Yap, whose title is minister of evangelism for the Redford Church of America in the Detroit area. In addition to general efforts in winning Orientals to the Christian church, he assists with preaching and teaching in the Church of the Savior and the Church of the Master in Warren. He and his wife and three children make their home in Warren.
