## 7-Up Bottling Plant Struck

REDFORD residents could be asking where their next bottle of "pop" is coming from in the near future.

That's because local bottling and distribution plants in Redford Township and Roseville for the 7-Up Co. have been closed pending settlement of a strike.

The work stoppage began Friday when members of Brewery Workers Union Local 88 of the AFL-CIO took to their picket lines. Their contract with the major beverage manufacturer expired at midnight Thursday.

A spokesman for the union called the walkout a strike for economic reasons. Workers are looking for

higher wages and improved working conditions, he said.

Local company personnel refused to comment about the work stoppage.

The Redford plant was apparently closed after Teamsters Union honored the brewery worker's picket line. Approximately 150 workers are hit by the walkout.

When the Observer went to press no negotiations were being conducted between the company and union but a check with the Detroit office of the Employment Relations Commission, the state's mediation service, revealed a state mediator had been invited by one of the parties to help solve the disagreement.

The Redford 7-Up plant serves a seven-county area.

## New Recreational Service Formed

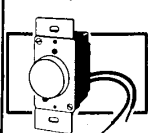

The moderator will be Ron Edmonds, assistant superintendent of the Michigan Department of Education.

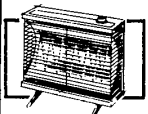
