## **Firms** honored for employing the handicapped

Continued from Page 1 ers in the Farmington area who should be recognized."

It's take more than a year, but Dolan checked and found businesses with handicaps. On Monday, those employers were honored. "You've given these people the opportunity to reach their potential," Dolan said. "We're proud of you."

THE CEREMIONY coincided neat-ly with "investing in Ability Week," which is this week, Oct. 1-7. The Michigan Commission on Handi-capper Concerns is sponsoring spe-cial theme days hils week "to in-crease public awareness and pro-mote understanding of the handicapper community," according to Gov. James Blanchard.

Michigan has about 521,000 work-ing-age people with handicaps. Yet a great many are unemployed. That's why Dolan saw fit to honor Farming-ton-area employers who have hired workers with handlcaps.

"You've done it, so it is possible to be done," said Jody Soronen, execu-tive director of the Farmington-Farmington Hills Chamber of Commerce.

Soronen related her experience -as well as Dolan's - of recently tak-ing to a wheelchair as part of Bots-ford General Hospital's Community Wheelchair Accessibility Program. She says she quickly learned the dif-ficulties.

"Certain things, ikke you can only eat food off the lirst two shelves in a supermarket because you can't reach it," Soronen said. "We have only a very small idea..." The program, in which 22 area businesses were honored, concluded with the honoring of Mary Wagner, who established the Community Liv-ing Centers in 1988, to provide peo-le with developmental disabilities a chance to live an independent life. "This is the woman who has done the most to the Farmington-Farmington Hills community to make the Wagner.

WHILE PRESENTING each em-ployer with a certificate, Dolan named the addresses as a means of encouraging the community to fre-quent the businesses.

"I hope people will listen and pa-tronize the stores. It helps us all to acknowledge what these employers are doing," Dolan said. "I hope next year at this time you'll see this place filled with employers of the handi-capped."
