

police/fire calls

Listed below are some of the Farmington area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week:

● BB GUN DAMAGE

Police don't know who, but someone used cars and building windows in Farmington Hills for target practice with a BB or pellet gun over the weekend.

The greatest damage, \$10,000, was caused by shots fired at the front windows of the Powerhouse Gym, 24385 Halsted. A dining room window of a house on Lyncroft was shattered by a shot, with a second shot putting a hole in the exterior sandstone above the window, police said.

Someone driving by a house on Dunstable fired a pellet gun from a gun and shattered a window, causing \$75 in damage. On Worcester, two windows of a house were shattered by BBs, causing \$95 in damage. About \$200 in damage was caused when BBs hit the rear door wall of a house on Indian Trail.

Cars also were damaged from BBs or pellets on Fox Creek, at the Diamond Forest Apartments, at 23260 Halsted, and on Brady Lane and Baywood, according to police reports.

● ETHNIC HARASSMENT

Several Jewish families in the Franklin Towne subdivision reported soaped car and house windows and shaving cream in and on their mailboxes during Yom Kippur, the highest holy day of the Jewish faith. Farmington Hills attorney Alex

Ornstein was one of the victims. He said the incidents occurred on Friday while families were at religious services and also on Saturday. The religious observance began at sundown Friday.

"We got home from services Friday night, and the stuff had been put on," he said. "I feel people should know this is happening."

Ornstein said he knew of at least six families in the neighborhood, with obviously Jewish names, who were victims. The incident was reported to Farmington Hills police Saturday.

● MARIJUANA POSSESSION

Four men in two separate incidents were charged with possession of marijuana, a misdemeanor, Friday and Saturday in the parking lot of Shin's Tavern, 30850 10 Mile.

In the first incident, police found three men, two from Farmington Hills, ages 26 and 24, and a 25-year-old from Redford, with marijuana in their car. A 27-year-old Holland man also was found with marijuana the following night, according to Farmington Hills police reports.

The misdemeanor charge carries a maximum penalty of 90 days in jail and a \$500 fine.

● BOY INJURED

A 7-year-old Northville boy was injured required hospital treatment after falling from the bleachers at Farmington High School Sunday.

According to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report, the boy fell about 12 feet, striking a

bicycle parked below. He suffered abrasions to his face and was unconscious when emergency personnel arrived. He was transported to William Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak, where he was treated and released, a hospital spokeswoman said.

● WOMAN ROBBED

A 36-year-old Farmington Hills woman was robbed of \$60 by an unidentified man Monday just after withdrawing money from the automatic teller machine at Comerica Bank, 29446 Grand River.

After she used the machine she noticed a car at her side. A man in the driver's seat pointed a six-inch long shiny object at her. The woman told Farmington Hills police that she was uncertain whether it was a gun. The woman was not injured.

"Give it to me. All of it," the man reportedly told the woman, who handed over the cash and her ATM card. The man left the bank's parking lot and drove onto Middlebelt, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

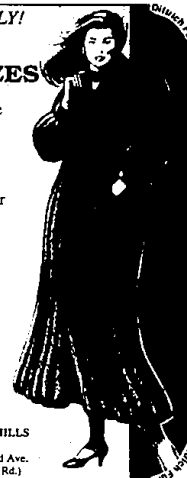
