

Workers dig in for sewer project

Traffic detours expected

Detours.
That's what many Farmingtonarea residents will be experiencing
for the next 18 months, as the city
proceeds on its largest infrastructrue project in history.
City officials said the \$12 million
project was off to a amooth start, as
backhoes tore into streets and
ground was broken for a 32-million
gallon retention basin.
The project began Sept. 24 in the
Brookdale-Nine Mile-Cloverdale
area, as contractors began work rebuilding, separating and repairing
older sewers in the city.
In the same area, work began on
the retention basin which will hold
excess water until it can be sent to
Detroit for treatment.
Farmington public services direct
Earl Billing said progress and
project timelines would depend on
weather conditions, including the
temperature and snowfall this winter.


streets have already been notified about the project by letter. Billing said other areas would also receive notification from his department as the project progresses.

A low interest state loan is paying for the project; voters approved a bond issue last May, from which debt miliage revenue will be collect-ed to pay back the loan.
