about cuting taxes. "Yet when we (Democrais) want to cut taxes, they won't go along." said Pernick. Republicans, however, dismissed the criticism as election-year poli-tics. "They're always asying we didn't cut taxes enough," said com-missioner Roy Rewold, chairman of the board. "We did great to cut taxes at all... not many places could do that."

DURING THE regular meeting of the Cakland County Board Thursday, commissioners voide to cut the coun-try millage by 0671 mills per \$1,000 assessed valuation. Instead of paying \$231.96 in coun-ty property taxes as he or she did in 1960, the owner of a \$100,000 house will pay about \$23.860 next year, or about \$3.35 less. The cut was mandated by the headles Amedment that requires the millage rate to go down when the tax have gets larger.

the millage rate to go down when the tax base gots larger. With Oakland's state equalized valuation increasing to \$25.8 billion in 1990 – up from \$23.4 billion the previous year — the Headlee Amendment required the county's tax rate to be cut accordingly.

SIXTEEN REPUBLICANS voted against the proposal, while the coun-ty's seven Democrats voted for it. "This is just another instance of Oakland County where Democrats have tried to reduce taxes and cut the cost of government only to be frustrated by the tax and spend Re-publican majority," Pernick said.

Blanc-bard s tax cut proposals, said John Kinney, a county commission candi-date in the 17th District which in-cludes all or part of Berkley, Latkrup Village and Huntington Woods.
