

Librarian invited to national conference

Farmington Community Library director Beverly Papai is the only public librarian in Michigan who will be one of 20 state delegates to the 1991 White House Conference on Library and Information Services in Washington D.C.

Three basic themes that will be addressed at the conference are library and information services for productivity, for literacy and for democracy. Papai has been working on the literacy theme. While at the conference delegates are expected to present draft resolutions based on these themes.

"They are reflective of our own perspective on how libraries nationwide can benefit from federal directions," Papai said.

For example, at the 1979 White House conference the state position on barrier-free ac-

cess led to increased financing for libraries for the blind, Papai said.

THE LIBRARY of Michigan trustee is working on access to information and intellectual freedom. "Hopefully we can have an impact on federal programs nationwide to improve library services," she said, adding issues such as the "equity of access of information" and how the character of information has changed, will be addressed.

Papai, who attended the 1970 White House conference, started her involvement for the 1991 conference with attendance at regional meetings, from which 100 delegates were selected for a state meeting. From that conference, the 20 national delegates were chosen.

Though not her keynote theme, Papai said

she has great interest in the literacy portion of the planned conference. "We need to be concerned with adults who have difficulty with reading. They will discuss what we can do to foster literacy at an early age," Papai said.

Conversely, she said, that there is a 50 percent chance of a child being illiterate if one or more of the parents are illiterate. "That impacts on education, that impacts on the work force," Papai said.

BEFORE HER appointment as director of the Farmington Community Library, Papai was assistant director 1983-85 and head of the Farmington branch, 1980-83. She was director of the Oakland County Library for the Blind and Handicapped 1973-79.

Papai has participated in both the Michigan

Library Association and the American Library Association. She also served in both elected and appointed offices that address the delivery of public library services.

In 1988-89, Papai chaired the Michigan Library Association public policy committee, which monitored and took action when necessary on pending legislation.

Officials heed residents' pleas to keep sledding hill

• Try to get more supervision on the hill during heavy sledding times. School officials said they may approach parks and recreation officials in Farmington Hills to see if

they are willing to help. THE SLED Hill issue was raised last summer when the school board considered a landscape plan to put staggered plantings of evergreen trees on the hill, effectively closing it. Several school trustees spoke out

against the plan, saying it could prove to be more dangerous than having no trees at all. The Farmington City Council also discussed the issue in June, but made no recommendation until they heard from the Farmington school board,

which owns the property. Trustee Jack Cotton, who spoke out against closing the hill in June, remained strong in his opinion Tuesday. "I'm very frustrated and angry with the paradigms of today," he said, referring to the trend toward

lawsuits and what public bodies must do to fight them. "There's too much good that comes out of that hill to shut it down."

Most council and board members also spoke in favor of keeping the

hill open, but said it needed safety modifications. Superintendent Michael Flanagan called the issue a "complicated one," and said he had received letters from the community on both sides.
