FARMINGTON International DeMolay Week will be observed here March 14-21 by the Farmington Chapter of the Order of DeMolay.

Purpose of the observance is to acquaint the public with the purposes and activities of the character-building organization for young men 14-21, says Gary G. Geha who is master counselor of the Farmington chapter and son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Geha of 3253 Nestlewood, Farmington.

THE THEME for this special week is "Action" and environmental action will be

the byword during the 1971 celebration.

The theme was chosen, explains Gary, because it is indicative of the Farmington chapter which besides providing worthwhile activities for a young man, "builds character and leadership qualities while helping to better the communities in which we live."

Events ranging from social activities, civic service projects, and cleanup activities will be included in the week's observance.

TENTATIVE plans include attendance at a state workshop, two church

visitations, and a visit to Farmington Township offices with all township files being filled on an honorary basis by DeMolay members.

The advisor for the Farmington chapter is Samuel L. Cole Jr., of 29982 Muirland in Farmington.

The Order of DeMolay was founded in 1919 by Frank S. Land and nine teens in Kansas City, Mo. Since that time, nearly three million young men between 14-21 years of age have become DeMolays.

Among the more famous DeMolays, says Cole, are John Wayne, Walt Disney, Walter Cronkite, Chet Huntley, Paul Harvey, Bob Mathias and numerous congressmen, senators, governors and business leaders.

Girls' sports activity will be retained with individual schools deciding which ones will have priority, the board has also determined.

Due to a slight reduction of personnel, track will be limited to what can be supervised by a single coach.
