Even if Plymouth wins its last pair from R.U. and Allen Park, Bentley would have to blow both of its last two for the Rocks and Bulldogs to finish in a dead heat. Bentley is 13-2 for the season, Plymouth 10-5.

In the district tournament, Plymouth will play this year in a six-team showdown at Franklin. Pairings will be drawn Tuesday, Feb. 23. The other teams besides Plymouth and Franklin are Garden City East, Garden City West, Cherry Hill and Churchill.


