Class is in for teachers, federal administrator mentality" and is less than useful to classroom teachers. In the words of James (Doc) Doyle, Observer & Eccentric columnist and Pursell consultant: "A lot of educational research is a bunch of crap." The money might better go to state departments of education or regional teachers' colleges like Eastern Michigan. Classroom teachers themselves need to be actively involved in research projects. "We need more collaboratorier research," said a Livonia master teacher. Teachers need help dealing with new social problems — kids from broken homes, parenis from Asian and other cultures, the continuity "activement gap" between black and white students.
