Radial Keratotomy

If you are presently nearsighted and wear glasses or contact lenses, a remarkable procedure known as Radial Keratotomy (RK) can give you 20/20 vision.

First performed in Russia in 1972, RK has been extensively researched since coming to the U.S. in 1978. No longer considered experimental, this operation is practiced by highly trained ophthalmologists across the country.

Here in Southfield, ophthalmologist Martin I. Apple, M.D., performs this innovative procedure with a better than 90-percent success rate. RK involves the flattening of a cornea with tiny spoke-like incisions using microsurgical techniques. The operation is brief and comfortable and takes less than one hour.
