Members of failed health club sue owner

More than 30 former members of the Women's Athletic Club in Bir-mingham are exercising their legal nucles, filing court claims to get their membership fees or parts of

their membership fees or parts of them returned.

These former club members are scheduled to argue their claims Dec. 13 and 20 before a magistrate at 48th District Court.

The club, on the corner of Hunter and Bowers, closed Sept. 4.

Club owner James Etiman, a Birmingham attorney who recently purchased a 800-acre northeast Michigan farm for more than \$1 million cab, said in September that he closed the club because of bad management.

At the time, Eisman had said he would try to sell the all-female club. But if he didn't sell within 60 days, he said he would consider refunding unused portions of membership fees. On Monday — 89 days after the club closed — Eisman said he wasn't paying memberships back.

"THERE'S BEEN a lot of misun-derstanding. I guess, because I vol-untarily offered to recompense them if the club closed permanently." Els-man said.

Elsman said four partners are negotiating to buy the club from him. "We're down to a few short strokes," Elsman said.

Juanita McNeal, one of the mem-bers who tilted the small claims ac-tion, said members have tried to the to Elsman, who wouldn't respond to them and hasn't attempted to relim-burse them.


