use at least two of the buildings for our operation." RRRASOC will do an our operation." RRRASOC will do an environmental assessment of the property, because of new laws gov-erning buried gas and fuel tanks, and begin the planning process as quick-ly as possible. Costs were saved in the areas of site development, heat-

ing and electrical, and sewer and road development, he added.

ALTHOUGH THE facility will not be completely operational in 1992 as originally planned, Deadman said he, hoped operation could begin some-time that year. The timetable will depend on whether any environmen-tal work needs to be done on the site.

RRRASOC preferred the former Novi site because it was centrally lo-cated in the authority's coverage area, but that Southfield would also work because the bulk of the recycl-able materials come from South-field, officials said.

field, officials said.

The authority originally formed as a consortium of clites, concerned with rising garbage disposal costsand the apparent lack of solutions to the crisis. The solid waste issue will continue to be at the forefrost during the next decade, Deadman predicts.

"That's going to be the issue of the '90s until it gets resolved," he said.
