

Advance scheduling helps program your cable time

Your adrenalin is flowing.

You've had preproduction meetings, your show is ready to be taped and you call MetroVision. Because you work, taping must be done in the evening.

Bad news: the studio is booked through the end of February every week night. What a letdown!

But with advanced scheduling, our MetroVision studio may be scheduled on Saturday. Please give the staff at least one week notice so they can arrange the personnel.

Our second community studio will not be available for use until April. We anticipate moving into the facility in January, with the television equipment scheduled to arrive in late February. SWOCC and MetroVision staff will undergo training throughout March and resident training orientations will begin in April.

Because of the sophisticated equipment it would be best to keep your crews well practiced so that adjusting to the upgrade will be rather simple. Remember, schedule your shoot ahead — especially for a Saturday.
