

# Quakertown sponsors 10 DAR Good Citizens

Quakertown Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) will honor 10 Good Citizens, their parents and school counselors at a noon brunch Saturday, Jan. 12 at Farmington Hills Branch Library.

Bea Radocker, Quakertown's regent, will preside at the meeting immediately after brunch.

Lacelle Fairchild, chapter Good Citizens chairman, will present each student with a Good Citizen pin, which is rimmed with 13 stars representing the original colonies. The students will also receive a certificate, a copy of the newspaper publicity and a copy of the DAR book, "The American Story in Art."



**GOOD CITIZENS** are high school seniors judged to have qualities of leadership, dependability, patriotism and service to the community.

All 10 are automatic contenders for the state competition. The finalists will be guests of the Michigan State Society DAR at its Awards Day in East Lansing, March 26-27. Fifty-seven DAR chapters in the state sponsor the Good Citizens contest.

Speaker for the day will be Kathryn Weiss of Oakland County Literacy Project. Her talk will tell of the efforts Michigan Literacy Inc. is taking to combat illiteracy, and how citizens can help.

At Awards Day, the Michigan State Society of DAR will present eight runners-up with \$75 checks, the second place winner with a \$150 check, and the state winner with a state's winner's pin, \$100 from the National Society DAR and \$200 from the Michigan State Society.

Michigan's Good Citizen will compete with winners from other states for seven divisional awards of \$250 each. Then three National Good Citizens are chosen. The second place winner will receive a \$1,000 check, while the third place winner will receive \$2,000.

The National Good Citizen will be presented in April at the DAR Continental Congress in Washington, D.C. The winner will receive a sterling silver Paul Revere bowl and a \$5,000 scholarship.
