Winter antique show opens Friday

Mullen said the time frame for his slide program on glass will stretch from the 1876 Centennial Exhibition in Philadelphia to World War I and will include cut glass, pressed or pattern glass, Victorian art glass and glass by Tiffany and Steuben.

Mullen said he had been involved in glass "for more than 30 years." He and his wife, Bobbie founded the nine-year-old Village Antiques Shop at Henry Ford Museum/Greenfield Village, now considered one of the most important of its kind as well as the Glass Study Group which meets six times a year at Farmington Hills Library.

There will also be two programs of appraisals: Larry Everhardt and Georgia Brand will give appraisals 12:30-4:30 p.m. Friday; Barbara Cook of Bloomfield Hills will be featured 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Saturday.

In addition to dealers from the immediate area those in the show include: Kenneth Probst Galleries of Chicago; James M. Babcock, Bookseller, Harsens Island; Melrose Antiques of Mt. The program selections are: Scherzo for Bassoon and Piano, Miroshnikov; Concertpiece No. 2 in D Minor for Clarinet, Bassoon and Piano, Mendelssohn; and Pocket-Size Sonata for Clarinet and Piano, Templeton.



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
