## Diabetics Invited To Classes

A new series of classes for diabetics and their families will begin March 1, at 7 p.m. in the Wayne County Health Center, Merriman near Michigan Avenue, Westland. The instruction is under the direction of Family Health Services.

A professional staff will cover topics which explain the condition of diabetes mellitus, its control and treatment and the relationship of diet. The importance of the diabetic's cooperation with his physician is stressed along with the patient's responsibility in caring for himself in order to lead an active, normal life.

All diabetics regardless of age may attend with written approval from their physicians. Children under 14 should be accompanied by a parent.

her position are still beyond reach.

"There's a private day care center in Plymouth that has reduced rates for hard-ship cases," she pointed out. "That's good, but I'd have to pay for two children, and the reduction isn't enough for me to afford it on what I could earn."

Parents Without Partner clubs would be nice, too, if she could afford them.

"But they are geared to people on a higher income level," Cathy added. "I couldn't afford the baby sitter or the clothes to go out, let alone the cost of their social activities."

ONE HELP she has found is the Mother's Club at Starkweather School, now attended by her oldest son. "The other mothers and the teachers' there are great," she said.

And her favorite extravagance is film for a small camera.

"We go out walking nearly every day," she said, "and I take lots of pictures of the children. Then on bad days we can enjoy looking at them."

Mrs. Walker has learned some carpentry to make a bookshelf and toy box, and she's glad her landlord is willing to have her paint walls to make her flat more homelike.

SHE'S GRATEFUL TOO for the back yard where her children can play and where she can grow a big vegetable garden in the summer.

But she'd still like some more contact with other adults--especially some mothers in her position. "I hope some will want to call me," she said. "I do have a telephone, and the number is 455-9487."

"I'm not ashamed to be on ADC," concluded this mother who knows the story of welfare from the inside.

"I hate it, but I'm grateful for it. For me, it's not forever."
