- THE DISTRICT IS NOT SEEKING NEW MONEY! THE STATE TOOK BACK \$5.8 MILLION.
- THE DISTRICT HAS MADE OVER \$1 MILLION IN PERMANENT CUTS.
- 22 OUT OF 28 OAKLAND COUNTY DISTRICTS LEVY HIGHER MILLAGE RATE THAN FARMINGTON.
- SINCE 1986 ELEMENTARY ENROLLMENT INCREASED 29%.
- SINCE 1988 THE DISTRICT HAS OPENED 2 ADDITIONAL ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS.
