# **Christian College** Planned In Area

Plans were announced this week to locate a Christian college in Farmington Township to serve students of all denominations from the Detroit metropolitan area. The John Wesley College is scheduled for construction on a 50-acre parcel on Nine Mile west of Farmington Road.

The Farmington campus will contain dominiories, so-cial facilities, a library, chapel and classrooms for eligious instruction. But the campus will not offer a degree.

THE STUDENT will take his major academic study at the university of his choice but still be able to enroll at the John Wesley College.

At this private school, the student can take "value-ori-ented" subjects such as phi-iosophy, ethics and history of religion. Classes taken at

Wesley College will be fully accredited and will be applicable toward the student's university degree, Armstrong adds.

In addition, the Farmington campus will provide housing, counseling and guidance, and a gathering place for study, social functions and open facilities for all religions.

"THIS IS an idea that will bridge the gap between the private and the public institution. It is an idea that takes the best of both and brings them together," says Arm-strong.

THE COLLEGE, open to all denominations, will em-phasize Christian and demo-cratic values and their roles in life.

The fundamental philosophy of the John Wesley College, Armstrong adds, in "great emphasis on individual responsibility in the world, the value of the free-market economy, the need for limited government, and the obligations inherent in the God-given rights of man."

Religious colleges may be declining, Armstrong explains, because they are trying to compete with state universities. They are pricing themselves out of the market because they cannot hope to compete with taxistopported colleges in facilities, faculties or libraries.
