To Fund Committees — By a vote of 72 for and 22 against, the Senate approved a two-year badget of \$150 and 100 for 18: 19 standing committees, up \$72 million of 6 percent from the hennial badget adopted early in 1989 at the beginning of the 101st Congress. After \$4.3 million in earry over money from 1990 was counted, the cost of the legislature was about \$1142 million. The measure (S Bre 52) did not require House approval and took effect in mediately.

The budget authorizes a 4.1 percent cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) this year for the more than 1,200 committee staff members, and anticipates a similar staff pay raise next year The present top salary for committee adders a \$199.125, although most are paid less. Also funded by the measure are foreign and domestic committee fravel, hearing, consultants, public relations and general operations.






