Inside a realistic outline of the African continent, Pavlovic-Dear plays the patterns of geometric shapes against abstract forms in almost mosaiced or stained glass manner. Patterns of colored shapes create mosaic-like forms. Pavlovic-Dear's description paints a visual for her intent. 


