2-termer Rennels to run again for school board

Susan Rennels has decided: she's running.

Rennels, a two-term incumbent on the Farmington School Board and the current board president, said Thursday she'll stand for re-election in the June school election.

Earlier this month, Rennets, a banking executive, had said she was unsure if she would run again. She is assistant vice president with First Federal of Michigan, as well as the manager of the 14 Mile/Orchard Lake branch.

"My employer is very understand-

ing about civic involvement, but I did feel I, should touch base with them." said Reanels, a 19-year resident of the district.

Her term is the only one expiring in Farmington this year.

PROSPECTIVE school board candidates must be at least 18 years old and residents of the district — al-though they need not own property.

The board of education, which manages a \$92 million budget, meets twice monthly, usually the first and third Tuesdays, unless school breaks cause conflicts.
