Both mothers and Alex's uncle participated in the two-hour dance,

taking time out to help hand out door prizes to the students, and to accept the donations.

"It's important for the kids in school to be aware there are handicapped kids in Farmington Hills," said Marge Houser. "The kids are so accepting. I hope they will go home and talk to their parents about it."

"I think it has been a very positive thing."

Janet DeGrave said she appreciat-

ed the East students' efforts, and said it is "good for the community and the kids. It's affected a lot of people."

Houser said the entire community needs to prepare for a generation of dealing with people who have handicaps as the population ages and medical advances keep people alive for more years.

"There are going to be more handicapped people in the world," she added.
