

S'craft Gym Has Growing Demand

The growing demand on the physical education facilities at Schoolcraft Community College resulted in the board of trustees requesting a study be made on keeping the facilities open longer. The board moved to have the athletic department and the business department advise them on the expense of keeping the recently completed facilities open on Friday evenings and Saturday mornings. The request was made after Dr. Eric Bradner, college president, read a letter from Livonia's Mayor Ed-

ward McNamara who complained that the Parks and Recreation Department had requested use of the gymnasium for one night weekly and it was refused.

McNamara said the request was for the men's volleyball program which involves 30 teams.

Dr. Bradner said the request was turned down because the gym was already in use for the college's basketball teams.

Residents of the college district do participate in evening courses which make use of the gym and other facilities.

"It is my feeling that if they (the facilities) could be made available on an even the most limited basis to the citizens who support the college, this would work to your advantage as well as to ours," McNamara said in his letter.

Student Senate Will Get Loan 2 Area Swimming Teams Top Meet

Schoolcraft College's Student Senate received a \$20,000 loan from the board of trustees to refurbish the lounge in the lower level of Waterman Campus Center.

Kathy Wiltie, Livonia sophomore, represented the Senate in showing proposed redecoration plans to the board at their recent meeting. She said the students thought they "could make it a warmer place" by partitioning the large area off into smaller groups of sofas, chairs and tables.

Although the students are just compiling preliminary plans, they hope to have separate study areas, a section for art displays and group discussion areas.

The lounge currently is a large, undivided area filled with tables and chairs, much like a cafeteria. The money will be repaid at a rate of \$8,000 yearly taken from the student activity fees. Each student pays 50 cents per credit hour to a maximum of \$7.50 each semester for student activities.

The senate has approximately \$12,000 of its own to invest in the project.

Corps Could Aid Cities
A "Clean Earth Corps" composed of students at Michigan colleges and universities will be activated this summer, Gov. William Milliken said in his special message on the environment.

The student teams, directed by state agencies, will aid local government and private groups on planning for the effective future use of land, water and air resources. Milliken did not indicate if the Clean Earth Corps would be paid but he did express hope that local governments and other organizations would support the program.

Two Observerland teams finished first in state AAU swim competition at Clarencville High School last weekend.

In addition, two state age-group swimming records fell and another was equaled in the two-day meet.

Livonia's Building Aquatic Club captured the team trophy for boys 10 and under, and Garden City's always powerful entry won the team trophy for girls 10 and under.

The Garden City Parks and Recreation Club, coached by Jewell Cooke, holds most of the state records in the 10 and under age group.

Susan Berger of Waverly

Swim Club, Lansing, won the 200-yard freestyle in 2:19.2 to surpass the record of 2:22.1 that had been held by Garden City's Cindy Brown in 10 and under competition for girls. Susan also swam the 100-yard backstroke in 1:11.7 to crack the mark of 1:12.2 that had been owned by Garden City's Carol Rusis since 1967.

Mickey Montagne, a powerful 12-year-old Grosse Pointe Park swimmer, tied the 50-yard backstroke record of 30.3 held by Carol Rusis.

Thirty-two clubs entered swimmers in the meet. Clarencville was selected to host the event by the Michigan AAU.

Tuition, Smoking Policies Revised

Three policy changes were approved by the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees in actions taken at their February meeting.

The board rescinded a former policy of giving resident status to part-time students who are sent to the college from businesses within the college district.

Formerly, the business was charged resident fees for the student as long as the business was in the district and regardless of whether or not the student was a resident. By rescinding the former policy, the board indicated it would determine a student's tuition solely based on his residence.

The board also expanded the college's smoking policy to permit smoking in corridors and offices of classroom buildings and the lobby, main corridor and offices of the Physical Education Building.

The college's policy regarding alcoholic beverages and narcotics was made more specific under the board's revision.

The original policy stated that students were "forbidden

to use alcoholic beverages or under the influence of alcohol while on college property or at any college sponsored event on or off campus."

The new policy includes employees and visitors as well as students, and "narcotics or dangerous drugs" as well as alcohol.
