It seems a bit much to portray Pickens' troubles as a battle between good and evil. But it's rare that such a classic confrontation between two basic economic philosophies becomes such a test of wills. Clearly, he has zeroed in on one of the critical issues that will affect how the car business will be run in the next century.
