Suspect faces mental testing

A man charged with torching a Franklin home April 25 didn't go to 46th District Court for a preliminary examination. Instead, he's headed for Ypsilanti State Hospital for court-ordered mental competency testing.

Frederick Boyer, 47, was scheduled to appear before Judge Bryan Levy Friday morning, but those plans were quashed when the defendant became a bit uncooperative. "Mr. Boyer won't be coming to court today," Levy said. "He declined to put his clothes on."

The judge said he had "a strong suspicion" that Boyer is "not going to have an exam for a while."

Franklin police chief Edward Glomb said the delay doesn't matter as far as his investigation goes.

"IT'S A PRETTY open and shut

case," Glomb said.

The Franklin police were aided by the Oakland County arson squad in the investigation, which has been basically concluded, Glomb said. A few pieces of evidence still remain at the Michigan State Police lab for analysis.

The \$266,800 brick ranch home owned by Ed Hersch on Franklin Park Drive was leveled by the fire. According to investigations, the house and attached garage were doused with gasoline, then set on fire.

None of the family members were home at the time.

Boyer was arrested in Farmington Hills on charges of arson and breaking and entering just five hours after the mid-afternoon fire.
