Many vulnerable to 'disease of the dying family'

The AIDS epidemic, which has killed 1,289 people in Michigan since 1981, could be considered, the disease of the dying farmly; said Joy Schumacher, AIDS coordinator for the Oakland County Health Division.

An HIV/AIDS report, compiled by the Michigan Department of Public Health, showed state and national statistics leveling off - but young Americans, minorities, women and children are becoming more susceptible to the virus, Schumacher said.
Aids could be considered the disease of the dying family, because of its effect on the women of child bearing age and their children.

Of the 2,980 cases reported in Michigan, 435 affected people between the ages of 20 and 29 - which is almost one quarter of the state of the disease of the dying family. Schumacher said with the virus schumacher said.

"The epidemic is hitting young Americans the hardest."

Schumacher said the number of cases of whites are higher, but in proportion to the minority population as a whole, there are more blacks and Hispanics getting infected now than before.

IN MICHIGAN, 985 cases of blacks with the disease were report-ed; 45 Hispanies were diagnosed; three Native Americans; and three

Asians.

"I think a disease doesn't know Eight Mite Road "Schumacher said, Initially, the predominant risk groups were homosexuals and intravenous drug users. Today, heterosexuals are now more at risk, said Becky Horan, nurse epidemiologist at St. Joseph Hospital in Pontiae. In the report, of the 73 cases involving heterosexual activity (4%), live were bisexual men. Women have to understand if they date a

bisexual man they can contract the disease, the esperts said.

"People don't realize there's a lot of bisexuality around," Schumachers aid.

A personal concern of Schumachers, is the effect AIDS will have on women and children.

Schumacher, who said she is a feminist, said women and children tited to have the resources and skills to protect themselves. And

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
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
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
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
