


Planners Ask Denial Of Regional Center

FARMINGTON Farmington Township planning commissioners voted 6-1 Thursday night to recommend denial of the rezoning to allow a regional shopping center on 300 acres on 13 Mile between Halstead and Hagerty Roads.

The denial came after a 3½-hour public hearing attended by about 400 residents in the North Farmington High School auditorium.

THE DEVELOPERS, the HTK Corp., will now ask the township board to overturn the commission's recommendation and allow the center which would include four major department stores and a total of 1.5 million square feet of commercial space.

Motion to recommend denial of the rezoning was made by Mrs. Grace Richardson and supported by James Moreen. Voting in favor of denial were Robert McConnell, Ed Raedel, Russell Nankervis, David Stader, Moreen and Mrs. Richardson.

Bill Jarrett was the only commissioner voting against denial. Mrs. Benya, who sat through three hours of the hearing, became ill and was not present when the vote was taken after 11:30 p.m.

Stader noted the planning consultants did not recommend for acceptance or denial, so, because the residents did not want the center, he would vote for the rezoning. He said the center was a planning standpoint.

McConnell said the center would force upon the township an accelerated growth rate it might not be able to absorb. It would force improvements in the northwest corner, he added, and higher
