The Center is still experimenting with types of programs and is open to suggestions from residents.

Especially popular has been enrollment in the large variety of classes offered at the Center. Enrollment has grown as follows: 41 classes and 414 persons enrolled for the winter of 1970; 35 classes and 360 persons enrolled for the spring of 1970; 22 classes and 223 persons enrolled in summer of 1970; 65 classes and 727 people in fall of 1970; and 62 classes and 662 persons for winter of 1971.

About six groups have been formed under the leadership of the Center and include The 50-Plus Club for senior citizens, a group of ladies who sew for needy children, the Farmington Naturalist Club, Camera Club, Bridge Club and Coin Club. Plans are being made to form an Armchair Traveler's Club to meet in the Center.

Some 15 community organizations meet regularly in the Center, reported Mrs. Taylor, and many more on a regular basis. Another 20 scout and youth groups meet in the Center and many young people have taken tours and become

involved with projects at the Center, she added.

Nine homeowner associations have held 22 meetings in the Center, she continued, and four business centers have held 27 meetings. The Center also houses the Farmington Youth Guidance Committee, Catholic Social Services and the Farmington Community Arts Council.

Sixteen wedding receptions have been held in the Center and two couples have even married at the Center. More than 2,000 persons have attended the 16 receptions.

Mrs. Taylor added that 55 special events have been held in the Center over the past three years and were attended by more than 6,000 persons.

The events include benefits, exhibits, field trips, summer concerts, the Discovery Series, flea markets, boutiques and bazaars.

Mrs. Taylor concluded that it was realistic to say 20,000 persons have used the Center in the past three years.

WILLIAM SMITH made a presentation of the Patron's Plaque which bears the names of all persons and organizations

contributing \$250 or more to the Center. Smith, Charles Hooker and Ed LaVanway were the workers who made the plaque possible.

Tuesday night's dinner was served by members of Farmington Girl Scout Troop 85 to 500 guests. Present were the early leaders who helped make the Center possible, such as Allen, Smith, Douglas, Hope Nabstoll, Ann Moseman, Mr. J. and Mrs. Robert Orlans, Dennis Pheneey, Margaret Schaeffer, and Mrs. and Mr. and Mrs. Harry Stultz.

Douglas paid tribute to others who had served on the board or undertaken special assignments for the Center, such as Bill Bowman, Max Davies, James Ebel, Philip Power, Fred Harrison, Mrs. Carol Kennedy, Joan LaVanway, Mrs. Bess Leitz, who organized the 50 Plus Club, and Mrs. Kenneth Perlin.

Others recognized included Mrs. James Welby, the Hagdorn family which lives in the Center as custodians, Mrs. Jean Fox, Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Stoll, Mr. and Mrs. Louis Gibson, the Center staff and many organizations in the community.

MUSIC FOR the dinner was provided by pianist Mrs. Nancy Combs of Livonia who once taught in Farmington schools and now accompanies the Max Davy Singers.

March 10 Is Deadline For Trees, Lamps

FARMINGTON City of Farmington residents still have time to order trees or electric lamps through the special rates arranged by the beautification committee.

Trees planted on public right-of-way will again sell for \$20 or for \$14 if the buyer wants to plant it himself on private property.

Trees planted by the city carry a two-year guarantee of survival under normal maintenance conditions. Trees planted by buyers are not guaranteed.

Township residents also may purchase the electric lamps being offered in two styles and colors that can be installed for a total price of \$125.
