Sen. Jack Van Vleet of Detroit said his city "will be ruled by a handful of thugs" if the bill becomes law.
"If they want that \$40,000 or \$50,000 salary, they should be a resident," said Van Vleet of Detroit.
"Our taxpayers in Flint would just as soon see their money out of town," said Van Vleet of Flint. He said that had only 25 black police officers in a force of 200 early in the 1950s before it negotiated a residency rule.
"They were joined by Republican Van Vleet, a volunteer fireman in rural Cooper Township, of Kalamazoo County, who said small cities also would be affected.
"I don't think government has a right to tell people where they can live. I think the collective bargaining process has the right to tell the people where they can live, Weathers said.
"As soon as Michigan Democrat, John Goff of Grand Rapids, saw that the bill would allow a person without a residency rule for the \$40,000 police force.
"You are going to find that with the 35,000 housing units in last week's inventory, you have another 3,000 or 4,000 units on the market in a city that already had its real estate undervalued... the very people you are trying to help are going to be hurt most."

Opposing sides agree on assisted suicide verdict

The dramatic murder charges against a California man who helped his terminally ill wife kill herself, should prompt the Michigan Legislature to pass legislation on assisted suicide, according to two Oakland County observers.
Both want the Legislature to remove any ambiguity about assisted suicide in Michigan. But they differ drastically on the final outcome.
Oakland Prosecutor Richard Thompson insists the Legislature should act promptly to outlaw assisted suicide as a matter of public policy. "Until the Legislature acts, police, prosecutors, physicians and others are in a quandary," said Thompson.
The prosecutor wants lawmakers to move on legislation that is introduced by state Sen. Fred Dillingham, R-Farmington Hills, that would make assisting a suicide a felony carrying a maximum penalty of four years in prison.
The Honigman Society of Michigan also wants prompt legislative action. But that rights-to-die group wants lawmakers to pass legislation that would make assisting a suicide legal in Michigan.
As a first step, the group would like lawmakers to adopt a moratorium on the issue. Sen. David N. Honigman, R-West Bloomfield.

HONIGMAN'S BILL calls for creation of the Commission on Death and Dying, with experts to advise the Legislature on a variety of life-and-death issues, including assisted suicide.
Michigan is one of 19 states that don't have clear laws relating to assisted suicide, said Janet Good, president of Honigman. "We want the state to act promptly in bringing the

Harper, 72, said he'd helped his cancer-stricken wife commit suicide as an act of love. The Wayne County Prosecutor's Office called it a maximum penalty of life in prison.
The jury did "the compassionate thing" by acquitting Harper, Thompson said. "I still think assisted suicide should be illegal," he continued.

Good admitted to some concern about the trial, particularly because the jury "seemed so young."
BUT THAT YOUTHFUL jury was experienced, Good said. "They asked for additional information (in determining) and they did their duty. I wonder why I ever doubted them."
Honigman, however, insists that Good said, because it calls for careful deliberation based on the best available information. "We just wish Congress would do something like that... to work toward a national policy on death with dignity and assisted suicide."
This is an issue that many people relate to," Good said. Many people want law that enables individuals to make their own choice.
One indication of growing public support for assisted suicide... and other death-with-dignity issues... is that membership in Honigman of Michigan has increased dramatically within the last year, Good said.
Last June... before Dr. Jack Kevorkian triggered public debate by using his suicide machine to help Janet Adams take her own life... the Michigan chapter of the Honigman Society had about 125 members, Good said.
Today... thanks to the public interest stimulated by the Adams and Harper cases... the organization has more than 600 members, she said.

'Not Without My Daughter' author at OU
Author Betty Mahmoody will receive her real-life bestseller in her lecture "Not Without My Daughter," scheduled for Monday, June 3, at Oakland University, Rochester.
The free program at 7:30 p.m. in the Chocky of the Oakland Center is open to the public. Mahmoody appears under sponsorship of the Student Life Lecture Board and the Women in Leadership Forum of the School of Education and Human Services.
The OU lecture is based on Mahmoody's adventures in Iran. The book began when the family fled the country in 1978 and her husband, a man who had renounced himself to the Shiite Muslim faith, then held them virtual prisoners.
The woman stood up to beatings, threats and life in a country where women have no rights and where Americans are despised.
Mahmoody will recount how she and her daughter, Marjane, escaped with the help of friends and how they made their way across 500 dangerous miles into Turkey and freedom.
"Not Without My Daughter" has become a best-selling book, a film, and the author has become president of and co-founder of "One World For Children," an organization designed to promote understanding between cultures and to offer security and protection to children of interracial marriages.
Mahmoody was honored by OU in 1989 as "Outstanding Woman of the Year."
