

# Schools set information meetings for May, June

State-mandated school information meetings are scheduled for the Farmington Public Schools during May and June.

Under Public Act 25 of 1990, schools must have a school improvement plan and a curriculum which identifies the learning expectations of each student. The law also requires each district to plan for accreditation at each school by the 1992-93 school year, and to share with the community the status and progress of these initiatives in an Annual Education Report.

A districtwide report must be presented by July 31; Farmington is expected to present its report at the

June 18 school board meeting. Reports are also prepared for each school.

According to information from the school district, the following schools are holding individual meetings at their respective buildings:

- May 20 — 7:30 p.m. Kenbrook Elementary School.
- May 22 — 7:30 p.m. Harrison High School Elementary.
- May 23 — 5 p.m. Longacre Elementary; 7 p.m. William Grace Elementary and Warner Middle schools.
- May 28 — 7 p.m. Power Middle School; 8 p.m. Gilly Elementary School.

- May 29 — 7 p.m. North Farmington High School.
- May 30 — 7 p.m. East Middle School.
- June 3 — 6:30 p.m. Dunckel Middle School; 7 p.m. Larkshire Elementary School.

The following schools held their meetings between May 2-15 and reports are available at each respective school: Alameda and Fairview early childhood centers; Beechview, Highmeadow Common Campus, Flanders, Hillside, Eagle, Wood Creek, Wooddale and Forest elementary schools; and Farmington High School.
