The council also will consider adoption of a resolution of intent to raise taxes 1.8 percent.

H.Y. Levinson dies at 91

"He encouraged young people and it was a nice thing to see," Burnett said. "My aunt, Marie Walling, wrote a book of poetry called 'Bit 'O Life.' Levinson encouraged her. He published articles about her and ran a poem every week on the editorial page."

Mr. Levinson was a pioneer in the broadcast industry, founding WCAR in 1939. He operated the station until the early 1980s. He was a member of the National Association of Broadcasters.

A 1922 graduate of the University of Michigan, he was active in the Alumni Association of the Victoria Club. He was a past member of the Detroit Rotary Club and the Farmington Lodge #648M.

Survivors, in addition to his daughter, include a grandson, James Lieberman, of Naples, Fla. Mr. Levinson's wife of 64 years, Cella, died last February.

Funeral services were May 17 at Clover Hill Park Cemetery in Birmingham. Arrangements were handled by the Ira Kaufman Chapel Inc. in Southfield.
