FARMINGTON Township Supervisor Earl Teeple has sent letters to four builders of subdivisions asking that sidewalks be installed along section line roads.

The action follows inquiries made following the death a few months ago of a young girl who was killed while crossing 13 Mile Rd. on her way to North Farmington High School.

Teeple sent a letter to the builders and developers reminding them that an ordinance passed in July 1968 requires subdivisions to locate sidewalks along the section roads.

Those receiving letters built subdivisions after the effective date of the ordinance, Teeple reports. He is asking for sidewalk installation as soon as the spring weather allows construction work.
