## O RECORD CATCH

An 11%-inch 1.44-pound hybrid sunfish taken from Doan's Lake in Allegan County has tied the state record, according to Department of Natural Resources fisheries biolo-

gists.
The fish was caught by Lloyd T.

Jarman on June 1 while stillfishing with a teardrop and redworms. This is the third record fish taken in 1991. A 6.76-pound brook trout taken Feb. 25 from Little Bay de Noc tied the current state record and an 11.60-inch smelt taken from Big Bay de Noc on April 27th was a new state record.

The Master Angler program, administered by the DNR's Pisheries Division, rewards anglers with a patch for catching fish which meet the program's established minimum requirements. A complete list of entry weights and current state records appears on the back cover of the 1991 Michigan Fishing Guide, available at local license dealers and DNR offices.

#### PUBLIC PROTECTION ACCESS

State Sen. John D. Cherry Jr., D-Clio, is expected to introduce legisla-tion to help protect public access to Michigan's waterways via road end-ings. The legislation is supported by the Michigan United Conservation

Clubs, the state's largest conservation organization.
Although public roads that end at
waterways are often used to permit
public access to the waterways,
county road commissions currently
have the authority to abandon the
roads and allow them to revert to
the-abutting-property-owners. The
property owners can then block public access to the waterways, In many
instances these road endings are the
only access the public has to the
waterways.
Cherry's legislation would protect

Cherry's legislation would protect public access to Michigan's waterways by preventing county road commissions from abandoning roads that border on or are adjacent to waterways without the permission of the circuit court of the county in which the road is located.

"Too often, local property owners encroach and even closs off those access points," said Thomas L. Washington, MUCC executive director. "This legislation will put an end to an increasingly common conflict without both sides having their day in court."

# **Exercise provides** sexual boost

Dear Myrna: Does working out make women more sexy? I am a 35-year-old woman who exercises regularly. I just started exercising a year ago and I do see a difference in my sexual desire. Could exercise really be the culprif?

I've been writing this column for about four years now. It seems every summer I get this question. A few months ago Channel 7 interviewed Barbara Schiffung partnery and I on this very subject.

In fact, it turns out that being ages 18 to 49. Eighty- three percent of these women exercise regular to those responses said they felt an increase in sexual desire immediately after physical exertion, while just 3 percent said exercise dampened their Interest.

The sexual boost is most evident in younger women. Thirty-nine percent of the 18 to 24 year olds surveyed reported an increased desire after exercise, compared with 17 percent of the women aged 45 to 49, It might be that older women are more in tune with their sexual being and this might help younger women to be in touch. More of this study shows that long term effects of an exercise program are, happily, even more pronounced than the short term benefit. Thirty-one percent of the women said they had sex more outdoned by started their exercise program. Porty percent noted their exercise augmented their overall self confidence, and 89 percent reported exercise gave their sexual confidence a boost.

My partner at the Workout Company, Barbara Schiff, says, "Self confidence is the ability to keep trying new things even though you sometimes fail.

"Self esteem comes from doing the very best job you can, knowing you are trying your hardest."

Exercise does raise self esteem because you are challenging your-self daily.

High self-esteem will lead to better sex.

I think the sexual confidence you get from exercising correlates with respect for one's body and an increased sensitivity in general.


