

Computer is key to television production

The Amiga 2500 is a computer that is an integral part of our television control room. Summer interns Michael Billings and Steve Randoel have been instructing residents of its finer points.

During a television shoot, the Amiga is a tiler (character generator providing the script you see on the TV screen). Its other features require many hours of concentration pre- or post-production, which are:

- Displaying up to 4,096 colors
- High-resolution graphics (computer-generated pictures)
- Graphics may be animated (pictures may move)

Billings emphasized that "Computers are designed so you don't have to know about the entire computer. When you are done with my class, you will be able to bring up the files as you direct or request."

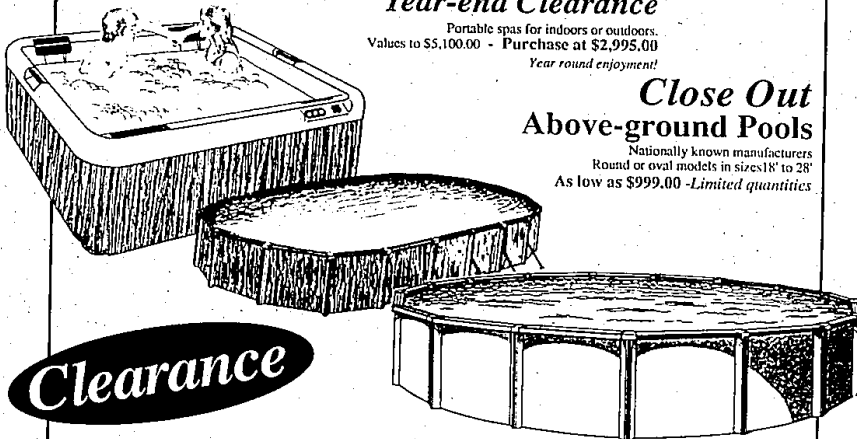

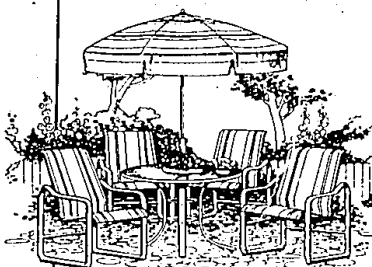

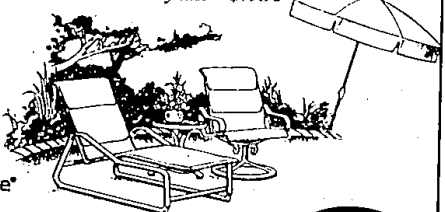
