Storm strikes hard

of undetermined origin at the A&W restaurant, 30732 Grand River, which caused major damage to a storage area in the back of the business. Two platoons were called back Sunday and another group called in Monday to handle the overflow.

A&W owner Bill Frank, a retired Detroit firefighter, arrived at the business shortly after 10 p.m. Sunday because his daughter had been having trouble with the ice cream machine because of power outages. He noticed the business was dark — unusual because some things are left lit — then noticed smoke and flames upon entering the business.

"The back room is charred — there's no structural damage," Frank said Tuesday. He said he hoped to re-open sometime in the next two weeks.

Fire marshal Joe Schornack said things were "pretty messy down there" with root beer syrup and other items around. Schornack said it appeared napkins caught fire, then flames moved up the walls and into the ceiling.

In Farmington Hills, a fire was started when a resident of Newport Creek Apartments on Elight Mile, lit candles, then went to bed. When firefighters arrived they found the tenant outside. The tenant told firefighters he closed the bedroom door of the apartment before leaving the unit. About \$40,000 damage resulted from the fire on the second floor of the apartment building, according to a fire report.
